


HUB+SPOKE MODEL



What is Hub + Spoke?

- The Hub + Spoke Model originated in the transportation industry, but many sectors, including health care, have adopted it.
- Anchored by a centralized Hub; everything either originates from the Hub, or is connected to it.
 (Ex: People learn about what's happening from it since it distributes that information.)
- The Spokes further the reach of the Hub by distributing the message to their extended circle of influence.

Why the Hub + Spoke model for vaccine outreach?

 The large number of vaccination mobilization efforts was confusing.

 Too much for one entity to manage.

 Establish Hubs across key neighborhoods to reach historically marginalized communities. HUB + Spoke partner agencies are responsible for developing and executing a tailored approach to outreach, education, registration, and individual follow-up within their service areas, leading to members of historically marginalized communities receiving their COVID-19 vaccination.

Estimated vaccinations

Across 42 organizations surveyed, it's estimated that **5,000 people** have been vaccinated through this HUB+Spoke network so far.

Phase 1

(3/22/21 - 5/14/21)

HUB + Spoke Model was formed in late March, shortly after the Governor's Office announced a Mass Vaccination Site at the Wolstein Center.

Goals:

- Build deep understanding of the vaccination ecosystem in Greater Cleveland.
- Become go to source for local partners seeking guidance.
- Be aware of the developments in their service area related to vaccination efforts/hesitancy.
- Recruit/ support the capacity of spokes to assist vaccine mobilization efforts.

Phase 2

(5/17/21 - 8/27/21)

Goals:

- Coordinating multiple neighborhoodbased pop-up sites in collaboration with local businesses, faith-based partners, schools, and other events.
- Their work will also include recruiting/training spokespeople, hosting educational events, canvassing, and reaching out to navigator and observer populations.
