


Cleveland's lead crisis



- CWRU studies underscore effects of lead exposure are long-term and cumulative
- Children with EBLLs are:
 - 27% less likely to be on-track for kindergarten
 - 25-30% more likely to enter the juvenile justice system
 - 34% more likely to be incarcerated as adults
 - Up to 50% more likely to rely on public assistance programs by age 23






Ordinance overview

- Proactive rental inspection
- Lead-Safe Certification with 2-year renewal
 - Clearance examination or lead risk assessment
 - Private, third-party inspections + home repair
- Evaluation and protection against unintended consequences
- Oversight
 - Lead Safe Advisory Board
 - Lead Safe Housing Action Board
 - Lead Screening + Testing Commission
 - Lead Safe Auditor

Lead Safe Home Fund

- First-of-its-kind fund + <u>replicable</u> model to support property owners and families to achieve lead safety
 - Lead Safe Resource Center
 - Lead Safe Home Loans + Grants
- 5-year, \$99.4 million target budget
- National RFQ to select administrators

Lead Safe Certification process

6 steps

- Contact the Resource Center
- Check your property
- Remediate hazards
 - Apply for a loan or grant
 - **B**e responsible for your own work
 - **C**ontract with a vetted worker
- Clean your property
- Get lead clearance
- Apply for Certification



Workforce development

- Pipeline to recruit and support new + experienced professionals
 - Clearance Technicians
 - Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Firm Certification
 - DIY Landlords
- Vetted, third-party list available to property owners
 - Two-part week-long training + field experience
 - Mandatory orientation and ongoing support
- Recruitment
 - Neighborhood outreach
 - LSRC call center
 - Information sessions for landlords
 - Calendar of scheduled training on coalition site + Eventbrite

- Remove challenges inherent in managing construction projects for landlords


Current Metrics


